Earl and Art Lane—brothers and alumni of Milton-Union Schools, both lived in West Milton.

In August of 1999, Earl, Art, and Denise, Art's wife, were on their way to a Milton football game when a drunk driver hit them east of West Milton on State Route 571. Art died not long after the accident. Earl and Denise were in Miami Valley Hospital for close to two months.

Art and Denise were raising four boys—Sam, Eric, Mark, and Matt. At the time of the accident they were 23, 20, 17, and 8 years old. They all graduated from Milton-Union High School. Art was a plumber and would do anything to help anyone. He was so important to the community and

very well liked and loved. Art and Denise were heavily involved in football and wrestling with their boys. They volunteered for many fundraisers and events.

Sam still resides in West Milton and is very involved in the community. Sam's two boys (Ethan and Charlie) attend Milton. Sam coaches little league football and his wife, Michelle is a teacher at Milton.

Mark also resides in the community and is the Athletic Director for Milton-Union and his wife, Lindsay, is a teacher at Milton. Mark was the head football coach for Milton-Union High School for five years until he was selected as the Athletic Director for the Bulldogs.

Earl lived 10 years after the accident but was never the same. His quality of life and will to live was gone. He was always an ardent supporter of the Bulldogs.

Earl and his wife, Sue, had three children: Tom, Terri, and Donna. All graduated from Milton-Union.

Tom and his wife, Missi, stayed in the community and raised their two daughters Amanda and Whitney, who also graduated from Milton. Tom is involved in Milton-Union athletics, formerly serving as the head coach for the Bulldog girls junior varsity soccer team.
